I regret to inform you that the JCU CARES Act Committee has declined your request for funding through the JCU CARES Act Emergency Funds Application. In reviewing your application, it was determined that you either did not meet the eligibility criteria or you requested funds for expenses in unallowable categories. The eligibility and expense category criteria listed below has been set by the United States Department of Education.

Am I eligible?

You may be eligible for CARES Act funding if you:

- Have been enrolled at JCU after March 13, 2020.
- Have a 2019-2020 FAFSA application on file with JCU to confirm eligibility.
- Have experienced a financial hardship as a result of the disruption of education due to the coronavirus.

International, non-US citizen, dual-credit, CCP non-degree-seeking students, students exclusively enrolled in online courses, or students who withdrew from classes prior to March 13, 2020, are not eligible for CARES Act funding.
