## **THE PROGRAM**

The John Carroll Young Writers Workshop (for students grades 8–12) will take place on July 14- July 19, 2025, on the campus of John Carroll University, directed by award-winning creative writing faculty from John Carroll University. We offer both day camp and overnight options.

Students participate in a rigorous and inspiring program that provides an introduction to the art and craft of poetry and short fiction. In morning and afternoon sessions, students study with acclaimed writers, engaging in writing-intensive exercises designed to address the elements of craft.
